

No-Dice Play Cards for Replay Baseball

Inside this packet you'll find:  
108 two-sided color play cards  
3 two-sided "shuffle" cards

This optional innovation is designed to replace Replay Baseball's dice with a deck of Play Cards.

Before starting each game, shuffle the cards thoroughly (the cards' layout has two results on each face which can be used interchangeably, so feel free to liberally cut the deck and spin some cards around top to bottom during shuffling (but don't flip them front to back—the red/white dice side must always be on the front and blue die side must stay on the back!) When you're done shuffling the deck, place it with the red/white dice side up.

We've included three "shuffle" wild cards. Feel free to use one, two or all three, and either shuffle them in while shuffling the deck, or insert them at desired points in the shuffled deck if you'd rather have more predictably-spaced shuffles. When a "shuffle" card is drawn, you'll reshuffle the deck before drawing the next card. We recommend including at least one "shuffle" card to improve randomness throughout a game, preferably two!

Optional method to determine fielder involved on these plays:  
Column 2- 56-60  
Column 3- plays involving the Third Base Coach  
Column 4- all plays except  
Column 4- 26-30  
Bunt chart plays:  
Fielder covering first  
Fielder handing bunt  
Except for the last row (bunt plays), use results on the LEFT column for left-handed hitters And the RIGHT column for right-handed hitters.

TO PLAY: To start the game, flip the top card over and lay it blue die side up to the right of the deck, as shown. The three "dice" shown constitute the three-dice roll for the first hitter (in this example, it's 1—4—3). In this way, every dice roll in Replay baseball now involves flipping cards instead of rolling dice, but otherwise, play is the same. As an option, you can use the results shown on the blue die side instead of the blue die for some plays, as listed on the card.

For each subsequent dice roll needed, flip a new card to reveal a new set of play cards and a new "dice roll". ALWAYS flip a new card for any follow-up roll needed, after the existing three dice shown are used. In the case of single die rolls, use the new RED die only. For any optional Column 4 plays listed on the red/white side, use these results from a newly-drawn card.

Always use only the top half of the cards for results (ignore upside-down bottom half).
